# III. Opening Remarks

- Commissioner Nate Silcox (Designee) on behalf of The Honorable Senator Doug Mastriano, Chairman of Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness Committee for the House of Representatives, announced that the joint study commissioned in December will commence soon. They will also be looking for the cybersecurity update.
- Ms. Kerry Vanyo (Designee), on behalf of Representative Jared Solomon, Majority Chairman of Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness Committee for the House of Representatives noted that House Bill 1854 was voted out of the committee on Monday.
- Mr. Connor O'Leary, on behalf of Representative Mark Gillen, Chairman of Veterans Affairs & Emergency Preparedness Committee for the House of Representatives repeated the cybersecurity interest and also that they are following the NG911 progress.

# V. PEMA 9-1-1 Program Update

Deputy Executive Director Jeff Boyle and Greg Kline, Deputy Director for 9-1-1 presented the following:

## • Legislative Update:

Deputy Executive Director Jeff Boyle opened with the information on the recent activity with HB 1854 and thanked all who collaborated on the initiative. Deputy Director Kline reported on the following.

## • 2022 Revenue Notes:

- Total increase = \$5.4 million (1.6%)
- Actual fee revenue increase = \$1.4 million
- Bulk of increase was interest

## • 2022 Revenue Distribution:

- 87% Formula
- 11% Statewide Interconnectivity
- 2% PEMA Administration

## • Act 34 of 2023 – Fiscal Code Bill

- Reauthorization of Title 35 Chapter 53 (January 2029)
- Increased monthly surcharge from \$1.65 to \$1.95 (March 1, 2024 January 2026)
- Efficiency study on 911
- HB 1854 Modernization of Title 35 Chapter 53 to reflect Next Generation 911
  - Reauthorization of Title 35 Chapter 53 (January 2029)
  - Addresses area such as GIS, Addressing, New Definitions, Right to Know, Cybersecurity
- 2024 Program Guide
  - Provides payment, eligibility, and reporting requirements for 911 funding

- Hosted sessions in February to highlight updates (legislation, formula, SERF)
- PSAP Annual Report refresher training (March 13, 20, 27)
- PSAP Annual Report and Service Enhancement Request Form (SERF) due April 15

## • 2024 Program Guidance – Revised 83% Funding Formula

- 3% will be equally distributed to each county
  - Remaining funds are distributed based on the following calculation
    - 65% of average quarterly funding formula payments from 2021 and 2022
    - 30% population (2020 U.S. Census data)
    - 2.5% population density (2020 U.S. Census data)
    - 2.5% square miles (2020 U.S. Census data)
    - $\circ$  No 15% funds will be used

## • #IAM911 Awareness Campaign

- www.pema.pa.gov/IAM911
- Almost 168,000 page views since campaign started in mid-October 2023
- Top 5 counties Philadelphia, Allegheny, Montgomery, Delaware, Bucks
- January 2024 digital campaign extended
- April 2024: Evaluate the effectiveness of the campaign
- Working with vendor to determine campaign performance and the next step will be to ascertain PSAP impacts

## • Imagery Project

- Multi-year project to support data collection for NG911. 1/3 of Commonwealth each year
- Last aerial imagery was captured in Spring 2023
- Quality Control of imagery ongoing
- Data is available on the PASDA Portal
- Next Step: Evaluate 911 imagery needs to support elevation data

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## • Satellite Emergency Voice Alerting Network (SEVAN) Replacement

- Phase 1 Issue Iridium 9575 Extreme PTT Kit. Provide basic training
- Phase 2 Installation of antenna and docking station. Removal of existing SEVAN
- Questions should be directed to your PEMA Area Office

#### • Telecommunications Outages

- Three separate events–September 7(Verizon), February 13(Verizon) February 22(AT&T)
- Root Cause Analysis, Corrective Action, After-Action Review ongoing
- Common Themes
  - Originating Service Provider Outages
  - FCC requires notification to PSAPs only. PEMA is only aware when Counties notify PEMA.
  - Notification provides high-level detail with no actionable information
  - Impairments vary by PSAPs
  - Public messaging is challenging due to varying degree PSAPs are impacted
